
This comprehensive program equips students with foundational knowledge, practical skills, and financial literacy, providing them with both career readiness and an introduction to real estate as a potential investment strategy.

PROGRAM STRUCTURE




Pathway to Real Estate

The second course dives deeper into the many career opportunities within the real estate industry.




Investing in Real Estate


Careers in Real Estate

By equipping participants with the tools to understand real estate as both a career path and an investment strategy, the program empowers students to make informed financial decisions.






This aligns with national efforts to promote economic mobility through education and career development, providing pathways for financial independence and wealth creation in communities that have been historically marginalized.

The AREP program is open to high school juniors, seniors, and recent graduates within two years of their graduation date. Recent graduates must meet additional eligibility criteria to participate. The program is offered three times a year—during the spring, summer, and fall semesters—allowing flexibility for students to enroll at a time that best fits their schedule.




PROGRAM GOALS
